
The Coordinated Activities on the Safety of Products (CASP) projects enable all the market surveillance authorities from European Union and European Economic Area countries to cooperate in reinforcing the safety of products placed on the European Single Market.

#### **Product scope**

The market surveillance authorities agreed to restrict the product scope to disposable hygiene products that are not classified as medical devices and therefore not regulated by the Medical Devices Regulation (EU) 2017/7451. Baby diapers, non-medical incontinence pads as well as external and internal menstrual products were defined as the four main groups for this activity.



#### Testing and results



#### Main testing criteria

The testing plan included the following European Standards (ENs) and Regulation:

- EN ISO 10993-18 Chemical characterisation of materials (AET calculation)
- EN ISO 10993-5 Tests for in vitro cytotoxicity
- EN ISO 10993-23 Tests for irritation

- EN ISO 11737 Bioburden testing determination of a population of microorganisms (tampons only)
- REACH Screening for substances of very high concern (SVHC).

### Key recommendations



Consider biocompatibility when choosing the raw materials and production processes for hygiene products.



Raise consumer awareness on the proper use of hygiene products.
